



## Member News for November 2025

Trees in common areas in Coventry are periodically surveyed, with an eye to whether they should be removed completely with or without their stumps being ground. Dead and/or diseased trees are approved for removal. Some trees infringe on sidewalks, curbing, or pavement. These trees may need to be removed in the near future. The board seeks professional guidance on how long some trees are healthy enough to put off cutting. Other trees that are likely to interfere with water and sewer lines are always considered. The following items represent major work planned.

- The tree in the island by 125 was taken down earlier this year, and the stump was ground. The costs of making a new visitor parking space or of repairing the curb and allowing plantings were compared. It was decided to repair the curb. (This work will start on November 20, 2025.) The asphalt repair will follow the next day. The area will be marked for the safety of owners, residents, and visitors.
- The maple in front of 120 will be taken down and the stump ground.
- The Bradford pear in front of 117 will be taken down. The maple behind 117 will be removed, and the stump left.
- A dead limb of an oak near 100 will be pruned.
- The dead sweet gum and dead oak by 100 will be removed, and their stumps ground down.
- The cherry stump in front of 111 will be ground down.
- The ash behind 118 will be removed.
- Pruning of trees behind 108 and trees near 104 and 102 will take place.
- Crepe myrtles by 113 and 115 will be pruned, as will oaks and maples at 137.
- Trees/bushes will be pruned behind 128, behind 110, and behind 122.
- Trees and limbs behind 126 will be removed (cherry and maple) and pruned (red oak and red tip.)

As always, owners and residents will be notified by RPM in advance of tree work in areas where safety is a concern. It is important that owners and residents move their cars by 6 a.m. of the designated day on which the work is being performed.
